Helping you to understand the NDIS and how to maximise your NDIS plan so your needs are met and you achieve your goals.

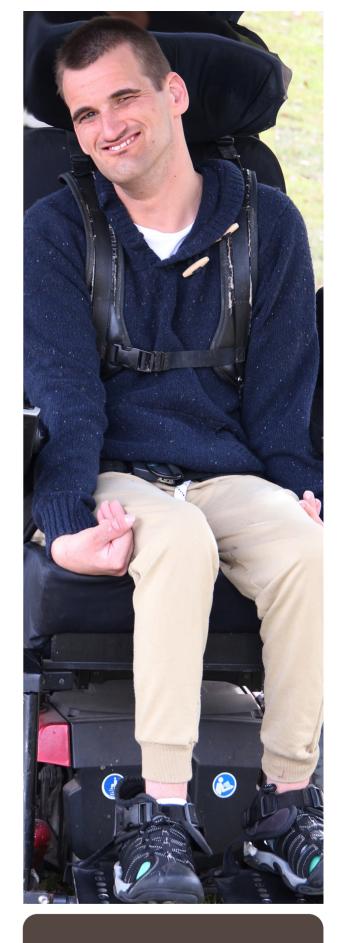


Supported Independent Living
