This Easy Read information is about **Safeguarding**.

Everybody has a right to feel safe and respected.

Safeguarding is a way of keeping people safe when they use services.

It protects people from being

- abused
- neglected
- taken advantage of
- discriminated.



Abuse means someone harms you.

For example:



- Talks to you in a bad way
(shouts, says mean things,
swears, ignores you).



- Is violent – hurts your body.



- Takes your money.



- Touches you in a way you
don't want to be touched.



Neglect means you do not get the care and support to keep you safe and healthy.

For example:



- Not enough healthy food and drink.



- Medicine you may need.



- Not the right clothing – too hot or too cold.



- Not clean.

Taking advantage of -

When someone is using you for their personal gain. Signs may be:



- The person asks you for money, favours, or other items.

- The person uses your belongings without your permission.



- The person asks you to do something which is against the law.



- You are being charged for services you have not received.



Discrimination

Discrimination is when someone treats you badly because you are different.

It could be discriminated because of your:



- Age




- disability



- gender or sexuality



- **Ethnicity** – Ethnicity is a large group of people who may have the same national, race or cultural origins.



- Religion



- Political orientation



Some safeguards we have for you at Identitywa



- We make sure you are treated fairly.



- Our workers are trained to keep
you safe and help you if
something is wrong.



- We have rules that all workers
must use when they support you.



- Telling us is ok.



- We listen to you and support you in making your own decisions.



- If something happens, we act and try to make it right for you and make sure it does not happen again.



- We make sure if something is wrong and we know about it, we report it and help to make it right for you.



- We follow the law and may tell police and others when we must inform by law.
