"About a year ago, I started thinking about moving out of home. I had been living with my Nan since I was a baby and I am now nearly 19 years old. I felt ready to take the next step, have a place of my own and live with housemates. Even though I miss Nan, I still see her during the week, which is great.

Planning the move and doing the transitions was really exciting. I was able to go over for dinner, meet my new housemates and the workers. Each visit made me feel more comfortable and helped me imagine what life would be like at my new house.

On the day I moved, I felt excited and a bit nervous at the same time. It was a big change, and I knew I would need time to settle in.

The thing I worried about most was the food. I wasn't sure if I would have the things I liked, and I knew I would really miss Nan's cooking. Now that I'm here, there are so many things I like about my new home. I've got lovely housemates who have helped me and the workers are really nice. Josh is especially funny and always makes me laugh.

Since moving in, everyone has helped me a lot, sometimes even pitching in with some of my jobs. I've been doing my washing with a little bit of help and soon I hope to do it on my own.

My support coordinator Kacey helped me find a new therapy team after I moved to my new home. They are helping me with budgeting, staying fit and healthy and making sure I have fun. I love shopping, especially online, so learning to budget now that I've moved out is super important. I'm trying hard not to buy too much!

I'm learning new bus and train routes to get to TAFE. Judith, my support worker helped me plan my route to and from Bentley and Armadale TAFE and I'm becoming more confident each time.

Now that I've moved out, there are new things I want to learn and do, like going out and about more with my support worker, getting to know the Fremantle area and meeting new people. I've already been to the E-Shed Markets and met new people there. I also met Eileen and Dale, who live in other Identitywa homes.

If you're thinking about moving house or starting something new, my advice is, it's okay, you will like it and have fun!"
